1. Title of the Practice:

2. Objective of the Practice:

- This System is introduced in the institution for the purpose of serving the needs of the students in the academic and their personal way.
- It is thus an essential feature to render equitable service to the students coming from different background. Mentoring System in the institution provides support to the students through advices and counselling.

- During mentoring Students (Mentees), academic performance in internal and external was discussed. Students' regularity and irregularity in attendance were discussed.
- Mentee's problems relating to personal issues were also taken up and suggestions were made accordingly, students were encouraged to take part in the co-curricular activities.
- Slow learners were identified and given encouragement and motivation. Advance learners were encouraged to reach their full potentials.

3. The Context:

The institute has followed the suggestion made by the IQAC, the Department of Commerce and Management introduce the mentoring system. The institute felt the importance of mixing such a system into the college management system. It had punctually and effectively put it into practice in the past two years. With an extensive variation in the student population with regard to economic and educational background, the system possibilities to provide a better understanding of individual students and bring out their highest prospective. It also seems to be the most effective method for justifying cases of slow learners.

4. The Practice: The Institution had taken the initiative to implement this system. Every year the names of all students are collected and allocated to mentors of the institute. They are divided into groups of 18-25 students depending on the number of students. Each group is assigned a teacher/mentor who is responsible for accumulating academic performance. The teacher/mentor is given required information about his/her mentees and is expected to offer guidance and counselling as and when required. In out-of-the-way cases, parents are called for special meetings with the Principal at the suggestion of the mentor

DODDABETTA OOTY TEA FACTORY AND THE TEA MUSEUM

An industrial visit to Doddabetta Tea Factory was organised on 7th-March-2020. The details are as follows.

Organised by the Department of Commerce and Management of DBIMSCA.

Timing: 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM

Participants: 70 students from B.COM and BBA.

The trip started from DBIMSCA campus, kumbalgodu, Bangalore around 12 PM on 6-3-2020 in three buses. The buses reached Ooty at 9:30 AM. Asst Prof Raju R, Asst Prof Vinayaka.T, Asst Prof Sushmitha. J, Asst Prof Manu .B and Asst Prof Renukaiah from the Department of Commerce and Management along with 70 students of first, second and third year B.COM and BBA visited Doddabetta tea factory Udhakamandalam, Tamilnadu as a part of their industrial visit. The guiding staff on the site was very supportive to all students. The main admin office of tea factory is located at Nakem hospital premises, Coonoor.

Objectives of Doddabetta Ooty Tea factory visit.

- To learn about processing like crushing, shaping and grading of tea.
- To know about the latest technology used and how the factory operates
- To understand the quality control procedures in Tea factory.

At tea factory the students were given first-hand information of the entire tea history and processing. They participated in a directed factory tour in which the history of tea and the different stages of tea processing like withering, crushing, cutting, tearing, shaping, fermentation, drying; cleaning and grading was described to them. The students showed keen interest in knowing all aspects about tea manufacture.

The visit was very fruitful to the students. All students were gathered at the main gate for the departure, where all the faculties took a group photo with students. We started at about 12:30 PM form the college bus and the visit ended at our DBIMSCA college Campus at
